



GOD OF CARNAGE NOTES

The publication STAGE AGENT says of the play: "Winner of the 2009 Tony Award for Best Play, God of Carnage relates an afternoon in the lives of two couples, residents of an upscale Brooklyn neighborhood, who meet to discuss a playground incident. Alan and Aaron's son hit Michael and Veronica's son in the face with a stick, resulting in two broken teeth. The four of them agree to discuss the incident civilly, but, as the night wears on and drinks are imbibed, the polite veneer breaks down. The couples initially spar against each other, but the men gang up on the women and the spouses switch sides as the fighting continues. Reza's play suggests that our civilized trappings do a poor job of hiding our animalistic tendencies and hostility."

GOD OF CARNAGE has a unity of time, place, and action. It takes place in one afternoon, in one setting: the living room of a townhouse in a well to do Brooklyn neighborhood, between two married couples come together to resolve a fight between their sons in which one has had two teeth knocked out by the other. Both couples are of high socio- economic status; educated, intelligent, prosperous. The couples decide to come together to resolve the fight between their two sons. They begin civilly, gravitate toward defensiveness, then resort to open hostility and aggression during the 90 minutes the play takes place.

GOD OF CARNAGE is a classic comedy of manners. The Comedy of Manners is a comedic genre that satirizes the social behavior and values of a particular class or group, often the upper classes.

The genre uses wit, wordplay, and irony to highlight the absurdities of social conventions, manners, and attitudes of the time. But can also involve physical farce and slapstick.

Characters in the Comedy of Manners are often well-educated, cynical, and manipulative, with their dialogue and actions revealing hypocrisy, vanity, and pretension. The humor arises from the conflict between the characters' public personas and their private motivations and desires. Despite its historical context, the Comedy of Manners is still relevant today, as social conventions and values continue to evolve and be challenged. The genre provides a way to reflect on and critique societal norms with humor and wit, making it a valuable tool for creative writers to explore contemporary issues and attitudes.
